

School start for newly arrived students in Burlöv 6 - 18 years old

If you have a child who is about to start preschool or school for the first time in Sweden, you can contact Citizen Service on 040-625 60 00 or call Välkomsten directly on 040-625 62 63.

Välkomsten is located at Kärleksgatan/Lundavägen 26 in Arlöv, in the same building as Vårboskolan.

Before a child can start school, guardians must register it at the office of Välkomsten/Vårboskolan and fill out enrollment paperwork. These must be signed by a parent or a legal guardian. Also bring a receipt for the asylum application/LMA card and grades from previous schools, if available.

Health check

Before a student starts school, he or she has a health check with the school nurse. A health check includes an examination of the child's health, development and well-being, as well as an offer to participate in the vaccination program.

Assessment for continued schooling

Then, an assessment is made regarding the child's language and previous school background, literacy and numeracy, which then forms the basis for the student's continued schooling. The assessment is carried out in the student's strongest language by a teacher. All information is compiled in an assessment profile, so that the principal can best meet the student's educational needs.

New school after Välkomsten

Newly arrived students in Burlöv attend school at Välkomsten for a maximum of two months. After that, the student starts at another school in Burlöv municipality.

Teaching at Välkomst Burlöv

At Välkomsten, teaching takes place in Swedish, mathematics and an introduction to Swedish society is also given.

Social Services

Social services work to ensure that children grow up in safe and secure conditions. Social services provide support and assistance to children and parents who are exposed to violence or abuse.

Healthcare and Dental Care

Asylum-seeking children and young people under the age of 18 have the right to the same healthcare and dental care as other children living in Sweden.

Adults only have the right to healthcare and dental care that is urgent (cannot wait).

In Sweden, you must call first and tell a nurse what your problem is, for example how you feel sick, and then you get an appointment- if it is considered necessary.

BVC Child Health Centre

For children 0 to six years old is located at Vårdcentralen Arlöv

At BVC, your child receives health examinations and vaccinations from the time the child is newborn until it starts pre-school. Going to BVC is free. You as a parent also receive support and advice about the child's health and development.

In Sweden, there is a vaccination program to ensure that children receive good protection against certain dangerous diseases. Vaccinations are also free and given at BVC.

Health consultations for adults

Vårdcentralen Arlöv has health consultations for adult asylum seekers (over 18 years old). A specialist district nurse conducts these health consultations. During the consultations, you talk about mental health issues and are offered testing for various diseases. The adult is called by the district nurse and does not need to book an appointment for a health consultation for adults.
